We offer talented researchers the opportunity to develop their academic careers while working toward tenure. While on our Tenure Track, staff have the opportunity to strengthen their research portfolio, hone their teaching and management skills and qualify for a permanent professorship. After no more than six years, you can receive tenure.

Our Tenure Track scheme offers a clear career development path from assistant professor to associate professor to full professor, within a transparent system of predefined appraisal methods and progression criteria. The structure is well-organised and provides ample amounts of supervision and support.

Small city, full of life

The city of Groningen is the economic and cultural capital of the northern Netherlands. Bars, pubs, restaurants, theatres, museums and sports facilities encourage a bustling atmosphere and an engaging character. If you do feel like taking a break from the vibrant city life, the beautiful countryside is never far away, with the Frysian lakes to the west, forests and heathlands to the south, and the World Heritage site 'Wadden Sea' to the north.

The city centre has a mixture of fine, historic buildings – many of which belong to the University of Groningen – and modern, innovative architecture like the Groningen Museum and the University Medical Centre Groningen. The city strongly supports the Arts; generously invests in creative talent; encourages research, innovation and entrepreneurship; and has an outstanding IT infrastructure (including a new Google data centre just north of the city).



Our location

FEB is located in the Duisenberg Building on the Zernike Campus in the northern part of the city. The building stimulates interaction between scholars, both within and across research programmes. It houses a fully equipped laboratory for experimental research and teaching, an extensive library and a very advanced digital library that gives access to all the catalogues, electronic journals, databases and research papers you may need. All staff members have a fully equipped office with state of the art IT facilities.
