

## **Applied Social Psychology**

How can psychology contribute to solving conflicts between groups, understanding the role of culture and communication in social relations, or improving health-related behaviour?

In our master's program, we highlight which social psychological factors determine human behaviour, and how these factors can be influenced. Based on social psychological theories, we outline how such factors can be studied, and how knowledge derived from research can be implemented in an applied context.

Social psychological research can deliver insights on how to solve societal problems.

Our sub-programme covers the following content areas:

- stereotyping, prejudice and discrimination
- crowd behaviour
- behaviour within social groups
- development and change of social norms
- communication within and between groups
- health behaviour

An important component of this programme is an independent, academic research project reported in a Master's thesis. An internship is also an essential component of this masters. You will have the opportunity to choose in what kind of organisation you want to do your internship to complement your studies and future career interest.
