

Career prospects

Due to its multi- and interdisciplinary nature, Euroculture graduates find employment in a wide variety of sectors where expert knowledge of contemporary European issues and integration processes is required. Some examples: EU institutions, NGOs, diplomacy and politics, cultural management, foreign trade, city and regional planning, education and academic research.

Fees

The fee for EU/EEA passport holders is: € 1.400 per semester without insurance and with the standard consortium waiver.

EM scholarships



The Euroculture consortium has a limited number of Erasmus Mundus scholarships on offer for European students and students from other parts of the world. The annual deadline to apply for these Erasmus Mundus grants is 1 December.

Who can apply?

Candidates must have completed an academic BA degree in either the Arts, Humanities or Social Sciences, or in a discipline relevant to Euroculture, e.g: European Studies, History, International Relations, Cultural Studies, Literature, Sociology, Political Sciences, Anthropology, Philosophy, Communication and Media Studies, International/ European Law, Theology. Each partner institution can select up to 25 students per year.

Euroculture Groningen

The Erasmus Mundus Master Euroculture: Europe in the Wider World is a unique, interdisciplinary and interuniversity Master of Arts programme. It consists of 4 semesters (120 ECTS). The programme is offered by a Consortium of 8 European and 4 non-European partners.

Euroculture graduates choose professions and research areas where knowledge of present-day Europe is of relevance.

The focus of the programme is on cultural and social developments, the political process of European integration, values, citizenship and cultural identity.

The programme teaches students the methods, theories and tools required to identify the European dimensions of social problems, to collect and process relevant information about European institutions and organizations, and to reflect on the cultural aspects and factors that play a role in processes of European identity formation and European integration.

Competences acquired during the programme include project design and management, cross-cultural communication skills, interdisciplinary teamwork ability and critical self-evaluation.



The University of Groningen

The University of Groningen belongs to the global top 100 universities on the three most important ranking lists (Shanghai, THE and QS World University Rankings).

The international faculty of Euroculture hold doctoral degrees in a variety of disciplines, such as history, cultural studies, political science, European law, European studies and international relations.

The academic and research focus in Groningen is on the notion of cultural identity and its relation to European integration in all its dimensions. Concepts such as “Europeanisation” and “Citizenship” are important elements in seminars. Trans-Atlantic relations and East Asia feature prominently in Groningen too.

Why Groningen?

As the economic and cultural capital of the region, the city enjoys a bustling reputation, while retaining a safe community character.

What will probably strike you most when entering Groningen is its youthful population. Roughly a quarter of the city's 195.000 inhabitants consists of students.

Walking around in Groningen, you can still feel a medieval atmosphere in some areas, while in



other parts you can admire ground-breaking modern architecture, such as that of the Groninger Museum.

The university has a visible presence: the historic buildings in the inner-city tell the tale of a rich academic tradition, while the University Medical Center Groningen is an example of eye-catching contemporary architecture.

With the city's many bars, restaurants, theatres, museums, parks and sports facilities, you will never be bored. But if you do feel like leaving the vibrant city life, the countryside is never far away either. Clear your head while enjoying the flat landscape and limitless view in all directions when you get nearer to the 'Wadden Sea', for example.
