The Groningen Centre of Energy Law (GCEL) offers a range of courses, varying from a specialisation in the general master programme to post-graduate courses in Dutch and in English. GCEL also offers in-company training on energy and climate law.

Specialisation in Energy and Climate Law in the LLM programme 'EU Law'

In September 2011, GCEL offers a specialisation 'Energy and Climate Law' in the LLM programme on EU Law. In order to obtain an LLM degree in the specialisation Energy and Climate Law, candidates must, in addition to courses from the LLM programme on EU law successfully complete three compulsory courses on 'Energy Law', 'Climate Law' and 'Energy Contracting'. Energierecht op Locatie is een post-academische cursus die zich richt op het Nederlandse energierecht vanuit een Europees perspectief. De cursus richt zich per onderdeel en energiebron op de gehele energieketen "van put tot pit".

De cursus Energierecht op Locatie is uniek. Het biedt een modulair onderwijsprogramma dat maatwerk mogelijk maakt. Iedere cursist kan het programma samenstellen dat het beste bij zijn of haar wensen en interesses past. Het onderwijs wordt bovendien op locatie gegeven waardoor cursisten ook kennis maken met de praktische aspecten van de stof die wordt behandeld en de kennis van wet- en regelgeving alsmede de kennis uit de praktijk samenkomen. - > Oil and Gas: Exploration and Production, University of Oslo
- > Securing Energy Supply, University of Aberdeen
- > Renewables and Sustainable Energy, University of Copenhagen
