Crash Course: Fundamentals of University Teaching

You are provided with tools to engage and motivate students. Also, you will be able to practice your teaching skills and receive feedback from your peers and trainer in a microteaching session. - describe the design of your course, including the learning objectives, and the teaching and assessment methods;
- prepare for your lessons and create a lesson plan;
- deliver interactive lectures and tutorials;
- create an inclusive classroom environment;
- provide students with constructive feedback and compare different assessment methods.

Workshop: Introduction to

Accessible and Inclusive Teaching

As educators, we strive to create an inclusive and accessible learning environment for all our students. But what does inclusion truly entail, and how can you ensure that every student feels welcomed and empowered in your classroom?

In this session, we offer a short introduction to accessible and inclusive teaching methods, with an emphasis on you as the teacher thinking about what methods you can employ for teaching in your own context. We will facilitate this within a broader discussion of inclusivity and accessibility, including some possible approaches, methods, practical tools, and the support available at the UG.

Learning Outcomes

After completing this workshop, you will be able to:

- understand some foundational principles and approaches to inclusive and accessible teaching
- compare methods that could be applied to your (future) teaching practice and course design
- locate tools and support for inclusive and accessible teaching across the UG

Workshop: Introduction to

UG Educational Support Systems

Within the University of Groningen there are several tools and programs that can support your teaching. In this workshop we will introduce the tools and work alongside you to provide support with practicing with the tools.

You will learn more about the Learning Management System (LMS) Brightspace, the UG e-learning tools, the digital exams tooling, the different video tools at the university, the student information system and the scheduling tool. You will learn more about the basic functionality of Brightspace and get to explore yourself what the other different tools have to offer.

Learning Outcomes

After following this course, you will be able to:

- find the most important tools for education (Brightspace, Progress and Ocasys) and use them in their basic form;
- identify all the educational support that is available for teachers and will know who to turn to during the academic year.

A chance to learn more about the fascinating, medieval city and its university!


The tour will cover how the UG has influenced not only the intellectual life of Groningen, but also its history, urban planning, expansion and atmosphere.

About the Teaching Academy Groningen

The TAG is a platform to share good practices and develop knowledge in order to enhance innovative education at the University of Groningen. Our Community of Practice is a professional, social space in which people participate in shared practices and learn together through participation in common activities. We give our participants the opportunity to come together, both virtually and face to face, to exchange knowledge and experiences, to learn from and with each other, and to produce new knowledge and shared understandings through educational research. As a platform for exchange and development of knowledge, we stimulate participants to build activities together. In that way, the TAG is something we co-design and consequently 'make happen'.

Peer Consultancy Group

Would you like to meet regularly with colleagues from various faculties to discuss your teaching experiences and share best practices, resources, and answers? Then a peer consultancy group under supervision of an experienced teacher might be something for you. University Teaching Qualification

After you have given a few lessons you might wish to receive support with developing and validating your teaching skills. The University Teaching Qualification (UTQ or in Dutch, BKO) is a proof of pedagogic competence for teachers in academic education. Because of the flexibility of the UTQ programme you can not only choose which module to start with, but can also decide in what period of time you would like to complete it. Hence the program is individually adjustable to previous experience, individual needs and the constraints of your new teaching job. 
MicroLabs
