



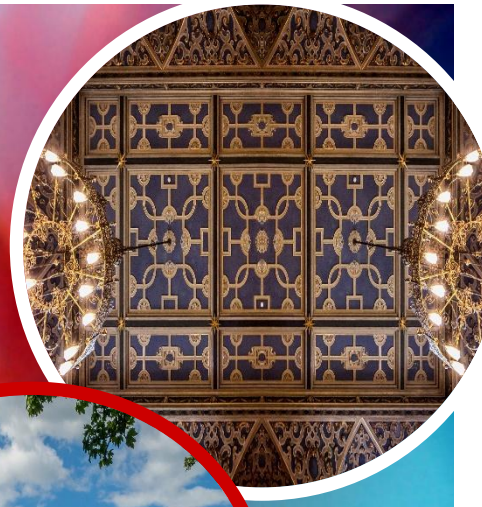

# Crash Course: Fundamentals of University Teaching

**Are you new to teaching and do you want to enhance your teaching skills? Join the Fundamentals to University Teaching course!**

This course is designed specifically for teachers who are starting their career in education. The programme includes an introduction to academic teaching, preparation of lessons and didactic skills. You are provided with tools to engage and motivate students. And you will be able to practice your teaching skills and receive feedback from your peers and trainer in a micro-teaching session. Moreover, you are introduced to best practices for giving feedback and assessing assignments and exams.



## Learning Outcomes

- After following this course you will be able to:
- describe the design of your course, including the learning objectives, and the teaching and assessment methods;
  - prepare for your lessons and create a lesson plan;
  - deliver interactive lectures and tutorials;
  - create an inclusive classroom environment;
  - provide students with constructive feedback and compare different assessment methods.

This 2,5-day course will be held in Groningen city centre\* on:

Tuesday, January 24th from 09:00 to 15:30  
Thursday, January 26th from 13:00 to 15:30

## Requirements

- English language skills at a sufficient level to present and to participate in discussions with peers;
- assigned teaching duties for the teaching block preferably directly following this crash course, like teaching a full course or at least a significant part of a course.

# Workshop: Introduction to The Dutch Education System

**Would you like to know more about the Dutch education system, your students' educational backgrounds and the Dutch grading system?**

Both secondary and tertiary education consists of different types of schools catering to the specific skills, level, and needs of their students. Students' trajectories may also vary as they are able to switch between schools depending on their progress and pursuits. Besides that, the assessment and grading standards at Dutch universities can differ from other countries' grading culture. After this course you will have a better understanding of the Dutch education system and be able to better tailor your classes to your students' needs.

## Learning Outcomes

After the workshop, you will be able to:

- draw a sketch of **the Dutch Educational System** and point out the **major moments** in the lives of pupils and students
- name the main **similarities and differences** in the educational systems in The Netherlands and your home country;
- explain how **the quality assurance** of Dutch education is organized, from primary up till higher education;
- grade your students' work based on **the Dutch grading system**.

- find the most important tools for education (Brightspace, Progress and Ocasys) and use them in their basic form;
- identify all the educational support that is available for teachers and will know who to turn to during the academic year.

# Discover Groningen: Guided City Tour

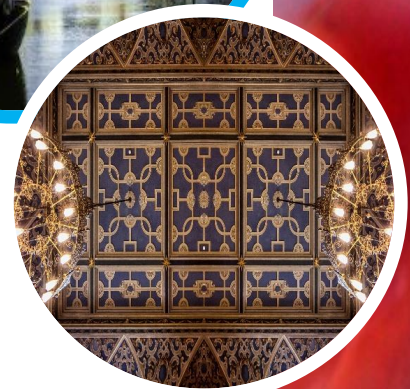
**A chance to learn more about the fascinating, medieval city and its university!**

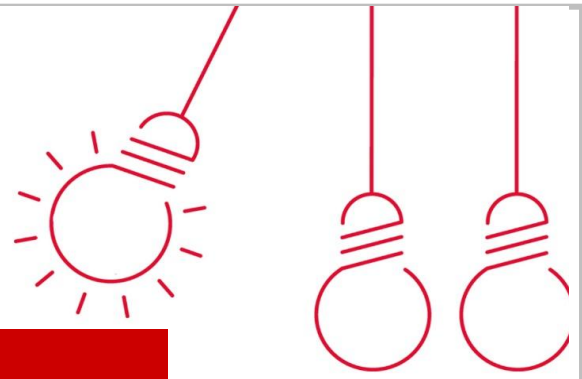
The tour will cover how the UG has influenced not only the intellectual life of Groningen, but also its history, urban planning, expansion and atmosphere.

### University Teaching Qualification

After you have given a few lessons you might wish to receive support with developing and validating your teaching skills. The University Teaching Qualification (UTQ or in Dutch, BKO) is a proof of pedagogic competence for teachers in academic education. Because of the flexibility of the UTQ programme you can not only choose which module to start with, but can also decide in what period of time you would like to complete it. Hence the program is individually adjustable to previous experience, individual needs and the constraints of your new teaching job. ### MicroLabs

MicroLabs are short, hands-on courses about a specific educational topic. You will first work on some small activities in Brightspace at your own pace and in your own time before moving on to the on-site workshop part of the MicroLab. . During the workshop, there is time to discuss, share ideas, and exchange feedback.
