

About the Strategic Partnership Framework (SPF) and our Ambassadors

The University of Groningen has introduced a three-year pilot project (2021-2023) to focus on nine of our non-European partner universities around the world.

The SPF is a positive strategic choice that aims to provide additional opportunities to research & education at faculties, and thereby UG as a whole. Its explicit purpose is also to increase internal collaborations and share best practice. Hence, it aims for the better allocation of funding, the development of new schemes for cooperation, and increasing efficient and qualitative mobility.

This does not only represent broader opportunities for international students, but it also means greater and more meaningful collaboration between our academic communities. To demonstrate that, Academic Ambassadors were selected among researchers from all academic fields to both connect, promote, and enhance cooperation between our faculty members and the ones they are in contact with from our partners.



Ronald L. Holzhacker is a professor (Comparative Multilevel Governance and Regional Structure) in UG's Faculty of Spatial Sciences, and holds an additional position in the UG's Faculty of Arts (International Relations and International Organization). He is founding Director of the Groningen Research Centre for Southeast Asia and ASEAN (SEA ASEAN), where he leads an interdisciplinary team of scholars and >20 PhD researchers engaged in theoretically driven comparative research focused on governance, societal impact, and sustainable society in Southeast Asia.

Bayu Jayawardhana is a full professor (Mechatronics and Control of Non-Linear Systems) at UG's Faculty of Science & Engineering. An Indonesian by birth he is an alumnus from both Bandung Institute of Technology and Nanyang Technological University. He is a scientific advisor to Ocean Grazer, a start-up company on offshore renewable energy production and storage systems, and a scientific advisor to Sencilia BV, a start-up company on biomedical sensor devices.

There is a lot of mutual interest, in particular, on science and technology exchanges to fuel innovation-driven economic growth. Other scientific connections in Southeast Asia include Vietnam and Thailand.
