Decide if your photo is appropriate for your CV. Is your appearance professional?

Personal profile & interests

Start off with a short profile text so people can get to know you better. Keep this short, about 3-4 lines of text is enough. It usually revolves around the following questions:

Who are you? What are you capable of? What do you want? What are your ambitions? What or who is your inspiration? A quote

Education

Moving on to your education. You mention your most recent education first and go back in time. This also applies to your work experience!

Month + Year What you studied

Where you studied

Optional:

- Relevant courses - Minor (abroad?)

- Thesis (grade?)

Month + Year etc

Work experience

Even if you don't have a lot of work experience, don't worry! Side jobs, volunteering and work for your (study)association also counts!

Month + Year What you did

and where

Results, skills, tasks and/or responsibilities

Place in bulletpoints and write in an active way.

4 Extracurricular activities

Mention board years, committies and other positions held in student or study associations. Make sure you mention jobs/tasks that match the vacancy and are relevant. The same a-chronological order applies.

5 Other

There are of course many other subheadings you can add to your CV. Here are some more topics you might include on yours.

Languages

Which languages do you speak or write/read? Put emphasis on those that might be useful for your future job(s).

Skills

Often included in your work experience but you may have different skills worth mentioning on their own. For example:

Digital marketing
Creative thinking
Programming

On your CV


Stand out with your cover letter

In just 4 steps, using the AIDA model! This model will give you an easy to apply structure to a cover letter. Here is how we suggest you apply it to yours!



Attention

The first letter in the model stands for 'Attention'. It is all about demanding people to listen to you. These are things you can do in the first paragraph of your cover letter.



Interest

Once you have demanded attention it is time time to let them know you are interested in them.

Why this job in this company? Show your vision and your drive

Desire

Now that people are interested, make them actually want you!



Show your relevant skills and qualities



Match the vacancy



Why should they hire YOU?

Action

Time for the final push. Give your reader an incentive to reach out to you and meet you face to face. "Let's meet!"

General Criteria

- 1 Pay attention to a clear structure
- 2 Spelling and grammar need to be correct. Have it checked!
- 3 Show enthusiasm
- 4 Maximum 1 A4 (one side!)
- 5 Avoid clichés...
- 6 Keep it to the point.
