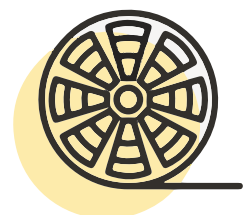

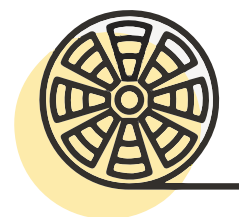

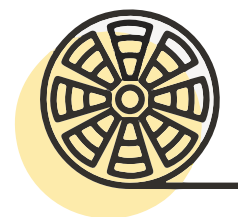


Talk/Activity - 16:45

Dr. Pablo Ampuero Ruiz, social anthropologist and documentary photographer. He is currently working as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Leiden. He also participated in the research project Worlds of Lithium, investigating lithium extraction practices in South America and Asia.
