Practical and General Information

Campus:

Getting to Campus/bus service:

Public transport in Las Palmas de Gran Canaria is very easy to use and there are many different lines. Depending on where you are staying you can use either of these bus companies (which have information in English with bus lines, timetables and routes) to get to and from campus:
