Or you may also want to assess the feasibility of your own business idea, or work in multidisciplinary teams with students from other faculties. Programme

The minor will provide you with insights from both a theoretical and practical point of view. It consists of the following five mandatory courses:

- Introduction to Entrepreneurship (semester 1a, 5 ECTS)*
- Innovation Management (semester 1b, 5 ECTS)
- Entrepreneurial marketing (semester 1a, 5 ECTS)
- Technology-based offerings (semester 1a, 5 ECTS)

 Entrepreneurship Project (semester 1b, 10 ECTS)*
