

## **Terms and Conditions**

## Talent grants master's programmes Faculty of Philosophy (2022/23)

- 1. The talent grant is valid for the period the student is registered at the University of Groningen as a full-time student for the entire duration of the Master's degree programme PPE or the Research Master Philosophy. Each grant is awarded for a maximum period of 12 months. Research Master students can reapply for a grant in the second year.
- 2. Combining the talent grant with another (partial) scholarship is allowed (e.g. HSP or a grant from a non-Dutch funding scheme).
- 3. The talent grant will not be awarded to students who pursue an additional master programme in the Netherlands during the period covered by the grant.
- 4. A talent grant awarded for a specific academic year cannot be transferred to another academic year.
- 5. Research Master students must comply with two criteria in order to be eligible for the talent grant in the second year of study: the average score in the first year is 7,5, and
  - all 60 ECTS credits must have been obtained by 30 August (September intake) or 30 January (February intake).
- 6. The student must comply with Dutch visa regulations.
- 7. The student will notify the International Officer of the Faculty of Philosophy as soon as possible of any change in nationality, type of residence permit and/or possible student finance by the Dutch government ("studiefinanciering"), throughout the academic year.
- 8. In case the student terminates the study programme prematurely, he or she will reimburse to the faculty the part of the grant proportional to the remaining number of months in the academic year.
- 9. Any case of non-compliance with the terms and conditions mentioned above will be reported to and assessed by the faculty board.
- 10. Cases of force majeure due to which the terms and conditions cannot be met will be submitted to the faculty board as soon as possible if they occur. The board will assess each case on an individual basis and determine whether a student can keep the grant, or (in the case of the Research Master) be eligible to receive the grant also in the second year of study.
