Admission and selection procedure MSc. Real Estate Studies

To ensure the curriculum and quality of the MSc. Real Estate Studies programme, a maximum of 45 students can be admitted to the programme. The Admissions Board carefully considers each and every application. To be admissible, applicants need to pass three requirements. If one requirements is not passed, the applicant is not admissible, and a rejection letter is sent. After passing the three requirements, each applicant will be ranked according to the summation of our scoring system (see **Appendix A**) and the applicant's weighted average grade (if necessary recalibrated to a 1 to 10 score using 2 decimals) to ensure a unique score for each applicant. The requirements and the rest of the procedure will be elaborated below.

Requirement 1

Applicants with the following bachelor programmes from a research university are eligible to the programme:

- Faculty of Economics and Business (UoG)
 - Business Administration (Bedrijfskunde)
 - Econometrics and Operations Research
 - Economics and Business Economics
 - International BusinessOr comparable programmes from another research university
- Faculty of Spatial Sciences (UoG)
 - Human Geography and Planning
 - Spatial Planning and DesignOr comparable programmes from another research university

Requirement 2

Applicants with the following proof of English proficiency, one of the following requirements need to be satisfied (in bold, the tests that are preferred), are eligible to the programme:

IELTS (Academic) 6.5 - no less than 6.0 on each section

University of Groningen Language Centre Minimum section scores C2 or C1 (one B2 allowed)

TOEFL IBT (internet-based test) 90 - no less than 18 for reading and listening, no less than 20 for speaking, and no less than 21 for writing

Cambridge English CAE or CPE Certificate English language test

Pearson Academic: Overall: 66 Reading: 64 Listening: 58 Writing: 70

LanguageCert Academic: Overall: 70 Reading: 70 Listening: 70 Writing: 70



Requirement 3

Applicants who score at least a 6.0 on the assessment form selection MSc. Real Estate Studies (see **Appendix A**) are eligible to the programme. The Admissions Board assesses each applicant as follows:

- To what extent are courses of prior education in line with *real estate and urban studies* themes in MSc. Real Estate Studies?
- To what extent are courses of prior education in line with *economics and finance* themes in MSc. Real Estate Studies?
- To what extent are courses of prior education in line with *human geography and spatial planning* themes in MSc. Real Estate Studies?
- To what extent are courses of prior education in line with the *research methodology* used within MSc. Real Estate Studies?
- To what extent has the applicant the expected knowledge and experience in the field of Real Estate on basis of prior education, prior experiences and the motivation letter?

A concise overview of the requirements in the admission procedure to MSc. Real Estate Studies can be found in **Table 1**.

Ranking

The applicants who satisfied the three requirements will be ranked on the basis of the summation of the score obtained from the assessment form selection MSc. Real Estate Studies (see **Appendix A**) and their weighted average grade (if necessary recalibrated to a 1 to 10 score using 2 decimals). This ensures that each applicant will have a unique score.

A concise overview of the selection tools used by the Admission Board can be found in **Table 2**.

Selection timing and guidelines

The deadline for applying to the MSc. Real Estate Studies programme is May 1. A maximum number of 45 spots* (*=45 minus the number of premaster students who automatically are eligible if they pass the premaster) will be available for the registration.

Applicants who pass all three requirements are admissible and are informed either in December or in June that they will be part of the selection procedure if more than 45 applicants are admissible. If there are more than 45 admissible students, the selection procedure will take place in June. The selection procedure then selects the applicants with the highest scores are ranked 1 to 45* (*=45 minus the number of premaster students who automatically are eligible if they pass the premaster) are informed that they are admitted to the programme in the following academic year (which starts in September). Applicants who rank 46 or higher will be informed that they are on a waiting list including their



position in the waiting list. Again, if applicants who are admitted inform us that they will not register for MSc. Real Estate Studies, the applicants on the waiting list will be informed that they are now admitted. Number one on the waiting list will have priority over number two on the waiting list (as such rank 46 > rank 47).

Note: Each admissible applicant receives a score based on the above mentioned items. For more details, see **Appendix A**.



For applicants, the registration procedure is as follows:

- Applicants register via *Studielink* before May 1 and upload the following documents:
 - Passport or ID
 - Proof of English proficiency level (only for – non-native English-speaking – internationals and Dutch students without a VWO diploma)
 - CV
 - List of grades of bachelor’s degree including a weighted average of the grades
 - Motivation letter (max. 1 page)
 - Two recommendation letters
 - Preferably your bachelor thesis in English but, if not available, a graded essay in English but, if not available, a max. 5 page summary of your thesis or a graded essay in English. All the information will only be used to assess the connection between prior education and MSc. Real Estate Studies.

- The applicant files are considered as follows:
 - Students with a Dutch bachelor diploma from a research university: through *Prospective Student Officer* of FSS
 - Students with a foreign bachelor diploma from a research university, a diploma of a university of applied sciences, or another higher education diploma that deviates from the above: through Admissions Office

The *Prospective Student Officer* and Admissions Office check whether the applicant files are complete. The applicant files, handled by the Admissions Office, are provided with advice on the admission of the applicant. The complete applicant files, including the advice, are then forwarded to the Admissions Board of the MSc. programme.

The categories are quantified as follows:

0 (none), 2 (to a very small extent), 4, 6, 8, 10 (to a very great extent). Per item the score will be decided by the Admission Board. The average of the four items is the overall average score.
