

ADDENDUM Teaching and Examination Rules FSE 2022-2023

Version 30 June 2022

Due to the Corona-crisis, the Faculty Board determined several temporary adjustments to the TER in the past two years. Most of these temporary adjustments are lifted for the academic year 2022-2023. However, there is one adjustment that affects the TER for 2022-2023. The minister for Education, Culture and Science has decided that the 'Bachelor before Master-rule' will be lifted for one more year, because Corona has still impacted a lot of students in the current academic year. The Faculty Board has therefore decided to adopt a similar adjustment as in the past two years:

MSc Teaching and Examination Rules 2022-2023

'Bachelor before Master'-rule

For the academic year 2022-2023, the Faculty Board has decided to apply the same transition arrangement as for 2021-2022. Students with a maximum deficiency of 15 ECTS worth of course units necessary for admission (from the post-propaedeutic phase) may enroll in a Master's degree programme. This decision also applies to admission to selective Master's degree programmes and for students who are currently enrolled in a pre-Master's programme instead of a regular Bachelor's programme. Master's programmes may set additional requirements for admission. These (renewed) additional requirements will be posted on the [website](#) in due time.

A precondition for the use of the transition arrangement is that students make a realistic plan with their academic advisor for the academic year of 2022-2023. If students have not finished their Bachelor's degree before 31 August 2023, they can not re-register for a Master's degree programme from 1 September 2023 onwards and will be required to first complete their Bachelor's degree programme. Any study results obtained for the Master's degree programme will remain valid.
