



Research (10 ECTS): learn and practise conduct of scientific research

- internal
- external, at another university or research institute

Or

Clinical (20 ECTS): diagnostic and treatment skills

- in a mental health setting
- only for students specialising in clinical psychology, clinical neuropsychology or orthopedagogy
- you need to apply at a mental health institution they decide whether to accept you
- requirement to qualify for postdoctoral clinical training program

Please note: clinical traineeship for non-Dutch speaking students are difficult to find/ organize.







- 3. Sufficient knowledge of the English language
- 4. Application before May 1st, 2024.

> No, as long as you are interested in research and you love to learn new things, it is great.


