### Biography

Hendrikus van Berkum was born on 3 November 1814 in Wanswerd, as the son of a preacher. Like his father, became a preacher and served successively the congregations of Wolsum and Westhem, Stiens and Nieuw-Beerta. He died on 7 November 1871 in Nieuw-Beerta.

Van Berkum also made translations of edifying, German booklets and wrote romantic-historical works, in which he outlined the pietistic movement in the Netherlands in the late seventeenth century.

His two most important books are *De Labadie en de Labadisten: eene bladzijde uit de geschiedenis der Nederlandsche Hervormde Kerk* (1851) and *Antoinette Bourignon: een beeld uit de kerkelijke geschiedenis der XVIIde eeuw* (1853).
