Transition Regulation LLM European Economic Law

Introduction

The LLM European Economic Law will be restructured per 1 September 2021. The restructuring mainly consists of a shift in focus in the programme, resulting in a shift in focus in most existing courses. The Faculty has also applied for a formal name change for this programme; the new name will be European Law in a Global Context. This new name will take effect per 1 September 2022. The name change is still subject to approval.

The LLM programme European Economic Law

The LLM programme European Economic Law will, as such, no longer exist per 1 September 2021, but students who have started the programme on 1 September 2020 or earlier will be given the opportunity to still graduate the programme under the 'old' name until 1 September 2022. Any students graduating after 1 September 2022 will receive a degree certificate with the name European Law in a Global Context.

Applicability

This transition regulation is applicable to all LLM European Economic Law students who have started this LLM programme on or prior to 1-9-2020.

Scheduling

For students who have to repeat courses, the new set-up of the LLM programme will lead to a slightly different scheduling of some courses throughout the year as from 1 September 2021. In addition, most courses will be renamed and some courses will be merged. The seminar European Market Law will cease to exist altogether and will be replaced by a new seminar (Interactions between Legal systems: Global, European, Domestic). The division of the courses in both blocks and semesters and possible changed requirements can be found in the transition table and the transition scheduling which are, together with this introduction, the complete Transition Regulation for the LLM programme European Economic Law.

When drafting this transition regulation, the Faculty has tried to offer the courses as much as possible in the semesters they were offered in in previous academic years. Repeaters can in all cases repeat a course they have not obtained yet within one academic year.

The transition table for the LLM European Economic Law indicates which new courses will replace the old style courses, the size of the new courses and in which block they will be taught. This table also holds the special arrangements that have been made, if they have been made.

Students have to have successfully passed all compulsory courses (either the old style course or the new course that replaces the old style course as from 1 September 2021) and have obtained a minimum of 60 ECTS can graduate from the LLM programme European Economic Law before 31 August 2022.
