

## Transition Regulation termination LLM-track Governance and Law in Digital Society

### Introduction

Due to a too low intake number for the track Governance and Law in Digital Society (part of the LLM 'Recht en Bestuur'/Law and Public Administration), the Faculty has decided to terminate this programme per 1 February 2026. Effectively no new intake will take place per 1 September 2024. Since all courses are only offered in the Governance and Law in Digital Society, the courses will be offered in alternative modes per September 2024.

Students have to have successfully passed all compulsory courses and have obtained the minimum of 60 ECTS before 31 January 2026 in order to graduate from the LLM programme Law and Public Administration: Governance and Law in Digital Society.
