

## CRASIS Bachelor's Thesis Award

The CRASIS board invites submissions for the CRASIS Bachelor's Thesis Award 2020. A prize of € 500 is available for the best Bachelor's thesis written at the University of Groningen or the Protestant Theological University in Groningen and dealing with a research topic covered by CRASIS: ancient history, classical languages, archaeology, and ancient Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

The deadline for submissions is **17 July, 2020**. To be considered for the 2020 award theses should have been submitted between 15 July, 2019 and 17 July, 2020 and marked with at least an 8 (out of 10). Students who wish to be considered can either nominate themselves or be nominated by their supervisor.

Submissions should comprise:

- a digital, anonymised copy of the thesis
- a brief cover letter (max. one A4) which contains:
  - o name of the author
  - o the title of the thesis
  - o a short summary of the thesis
  - o a description of the context (department, programme, supervisor, etc.) in which the thesis was written
  - o the final grade for the thesis

The thesis and cover letter should be sent as separate PDF attachments to the CRASIS secretary at <a href="mailto:crasis.aws@rug.nl">crasis.aws@rug.nl</a>. Assessments will take place on the basis of the anonymised thesis only. The winner of the 2020 Thesis Award will be announced at the first Ancient World Seminar in the 2020–2021 academic year (17 September, 2019).
