Groningen Institute for Evolutionary Life Sciences (GELIFES)	NWO Life - Seize the opportunity to present your work at NWO Life before 16 April 2024 (poster presentations). Kapteyn Astronomical Institute & Zernike Institute for Advanced Materials (ZIAM)	FSE researchers will participate as Twinning-partners in three research projects in the Czech Republic, Spain, and Estonia. Twinning grants from the European Union help countries lagging behind in research and innovation performance advance by linking them to leading European and international counterparts. The grant of €1.5 million per project is part of the EU's 'Horizon Europe' programme. - Prof. Raffaella Morganti and Prof. Reynier Peletier of the Kapteyn Astronomical Institute will help strengthen the position of the Instituto de Astrofísica de Canarias (IAC) on Tenerife in the field of galaxy research. - Also from Kapteyn Astronomical Institute, Prof. Rien van de Weygaert will collaborate with Tartu Observatory of the University of Tartu to answer the question of the role of the cosmic web in the formation and evolution of galaxies. - Prof. Giuseppe Portale of the Zernike Institute for Advanced Materials will lead the in-situ characterization and polymer design activities and coordinate knowledge transfer on the use of large-scale facilities.			
Zernike Institute for Advanced Materials (ZIAM)	The Dutch Research Council (NWO) has awarded M-1 grants in the Exact and Natural Sciences domain to Prof. Wouter Roos. Roos will receive EUR 375,000 for research on how a virus assembles itself.
