Money matters

The grant proposal was submitted last week. The selection procedure for this grant takes several months. Therefore we will not know on short-term whether our proposal will be granted or not.

It really would be great if we get this grant because that would allow me to spend more time on the chromosome 6 research project. In that case, I will be able to expand my work from collecting data to analyzing all information and writing the first papers in order to make the information available to the medical community. Moreover, the grant will enable us for the next period of three years to build an interactive website with detailed information on specific chromosome 6 anomalies, and to study what the impact of such a website for families is.
