

Talent Grants

Philosophy Research Master programme

Purpose: Philosophy Research Master (2 years)

All non-EU/EEA students receive a grant covering 50% of the

tuition fee. Additional talent grants are available.

The (talent) grants are financed by the Faculty of Philosophy. The grant can be awarded to international students with a nationality

from a non-EU/EEA country who have been conditionally

admitted to the Research Master's programme.

Number of talent grants: 3 (2 for September intake, 1 for February intake)

Amount of talent grants: €5.000, awarded for a maximum of two academic years (if

in compliance with the <u>Terms and Conditions</u>)

Deadline for application: 1 April. By applying to the programme, the student is

automatically considered for a grant

Selection criteria

Eligibility: All admissible students from non-EU/EEA countries are eligible.

Candidates:

- 1. Hold a non-EU/EEA passport and will not be eligible for support under the Dutch system of study grants and loans ("studiefinanciering")
- 2. Have been admitted to the Research Master Philosophy
- 3. Have excellent academic performance and grades for their undergraduate or other prior education
- 4. Do not already have a master's degree from an educational institution in the Netherlands
- 5. Have excellent English language proficiency, in accordance with the admission requirements of the programme
- 6. Will be available for the whole period of the programme and will take part in the entire programme
- 7. Confirm in writing their agreement with the <u>Terms and</u> Conditions of the grant when awarded to them

A selection committee will review all admissible applications and decide on the basis of academic merit. Applicants will be informed about the result by 1 May.

Please note

The talent grant is not a full scholarship. Non-EU/EEA students will need to acquire additional funding to finance their studies. One of the conditions of obtaining a visa and residence permit in the Netherlands is that students (annually) submit proof of sufficient financial means to cover their study period in the Netherlands. This amounts to approx. €12.000 per year (not including tuition fee), to cover the costs for rent, insurance, living expenses, study material, etc.
