



## Terms and Conditions

### Partial tuition fee waiver for non-EU/EEA students (2020/21)

1. Students with a nationality of a non-EU/EEA country, who are required to pay the institutional (high) tuition fee for the Master's programmes of the Faculty of Philosophy, are eligible for a 50% fee waiver. The fee waiver is granted for one academic year. Only Research Master students are eligible for a fee waiver for the second year of their study programme.
2. The fee waiver will not be awarded to students who pursue an additional master programme in the Netherlands during the period covered by the grant.
3. The fee waiver is granted for a specific academic year, during which the student is registered as a full-time student at the Faculty of Philosophy.
4. Research Master students must have obtained a minimum of 45 ECTS credits by 30 August (September intake) or 30 January (February intake) in order to be eligible for the fee waiver in the second year of study.
5. The student must comply with Dutch visa regulations.
6. The student will notify the International Officer of the Faculty of Philosophy as soon as possible of any change in nationality, type of residence permit, and other changes, which will influence the type of tuition fee he or she is required to pay to the University of Groningen.
7. In case the student terminates his or her studies at the Faculty of Philosophy, or in case of premature termination of enrolment at the University of Groningen, any reimbursement of tuition fees will be made to the faculty in accordance with the "Regeling beëindiging inschrijving en restitutie collegegeld" (regulation on termination of registration and restitution of tuition fee).
8. For this, the student will submit the deregistration form to the international office, indicating on the form the account number of the faculty. If applicable, the student will subsequently be reimbursed part of the tuition fee on a pro rata basis.
9. Any case of non-compliance with the terms and conditions mentioned above will be reported to and assessed by the faculty board.
