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Erythropoietin in cardiac ischemia

The cover illustration depicts the face of Janus, Roman god of gates and beginnings. Janus was frequently used to symbolize change and transition, one face reflecting on the past while the other face looks forward into the future. In cells, erythropoietin activates JAK (Janus kinase), which contains two domains critical for signal transduction. The two faces of Janus may also symbolize the “old” hematopoietic and “new” non-hematopoietic functions of erythropoietin, as well as the two effects of erythropoietin in the heart: inhibition of apoptosis and stimulation of neovascularization.
