### Overall statement

I'm included in the 2023 Stanford University list of the top 2% of scientists ([link](#)). I have an extensive publication record with over 175 papers in refereed journals, over 50 chapters in edited books, 9 edited books, 1 coauthored book, and many other publications. Various works have been translated into Arabic, Chinese, Farsi (Persian), Finnish, French, Italian, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish or Turkish. As at March 2024, collectively my publications have received over 11,500 cites in Scopus (H score of 50) and over 27,000 cites in [Google Scholar](#) (H score of 74). In Scopus, 26 publications have over 100 citations each.

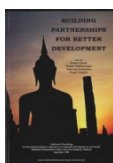

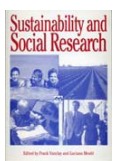

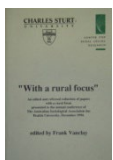
